FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time July 7, 2019

"At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them 'the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves."

Imagine being one of those sent. Who is your companion, as you go to bring the message of Jesus to someone else? Is your partner the talkative type, allowing you to remain present, but quiet? To whom will you go, either knocking on a door, stopping by a hospital bed, saying hello to someone in the laundromat? Isn't it interesting to wrestle with the answers?

Well, you are one of the lucky ones, not among the seventy-two, but among all the baptized to work in bringing in the harvest. If someone doesn't do his or her part, the harvest fails, dies, or simply rots. It is out there and the Lord needs people to follow His call as priests and deacons, as religious and committed lay workers, as missionary disciples. The good thing is, we do not do it alone but the Lord accompanies you.

There is work to be done and I heard that He is asking you to do it. Talk to someone about it today and fulfill your potential.

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

Teamwork is the

key to living life in harmony, so that we can do God's will. At this time, while still carrying on our



regular help for those in need of food and personal care items, we are cooperating with another church and a local agency to help a very special family. We

are asking that you be part of our team! We have a family of 4, mom, dad, two children ages 5 & 8. Both parents are in the health care field and work hard to care for their family. Never having asked for help before they were referred to us for help in their dire situation. Six months ago dad collapsed at work and was taken to the hospital, unable to breathe. At the ER he was sent to Geisinger Danville and then to Johns Hopkins Hospital. Many tests and long days later, a diagnosis has yet to be made and his problems continue. Having not been able to return to work and relying only on mom's income, they have fallen behind on monthly bills, rent and insurances. He has been placed on very expensive medications, home oxygen, nebulizers and a heart monitor. Also, they now incur travel costs back and forth to JHH, co-pays and hotel costs. At this time we, along with another church and a local agency, are running a special fundraiser for this family. We have put this on our Facebook page, sent it out on our Human Service data base and now are asking you to please give generously to our "Family BG". You can use our Facebook page or place your donation marked "Family BG" in the collection basket or bring or mail it to the parish office. Working as a team we can help this family.
