Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
July 17, 2022

“Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church, of which I am a minister, in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past.”

As Paul wrote words of encouragement to many communities, he identified his pain with the suffering Christ. He was acutely aware of his role and mission. As our world suffers with war, poverty and injustice, we can identify with ways to ease the suffering of others through prayer, through our voices, through our actions. At the same time take a moment to pray for our priests and ministers striving to bring the peace and comfort of Christ to others. Speak a kind word about your ministers in assisting them in their need. Paul wrote other letters from jail, from shipwreck, unjust trials, yet continued to serve. May we find ways to support our ministers in their ministry and carry out our tasks as well.

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water to refresh themselves. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.


Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name. Paul hopes that through his sacrifices, many people will become complete in Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.
