HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly
Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ
Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
June 26, 2022

“But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself... I say this then, live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh.”

St. Paul spoke to the Galatians, and his message demands that we listen today. Surrounded by so much that draws us away from Christ, we need the Spirit to have self-esteem and respect, love for others, so that we can express our love of God. Maybe we should take them in the same order. Use the word 'I' and 'Mine' less frequently. Avoid the terrible allure of the internet and porn. Discover the richness of our faith in prayer, learning and good works.

Believe in the following steps. I am loved immensely by God. I do not earn it, He showers His love, life and forgiveness on me, at this very moment. Convinced of this reality, I live my care and concern for others, as they too are loved by God and made in His image and likeness. I am then truly free to love my God.

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21

Elijah the prophet followed God's instruction to appoint a man named Elisha as his successor. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha, who went and said good-bye to his family, then followed Elijah without question.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Paul reminds us that people were freed from the old law through Christ. But he makes it clear that this freedom does not mean giving in to evil desires. Instead, we must

be guided by the Spirit and most importantly love our neighbor as ourselves.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Jesus set out for Jerusalem, and passed through a town where he was not welcomed. He reprimanded his disciples for desiring vengeance against the town. One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.

EMERGENCY EXITS
